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1. GSMA Antitrust Policy and Agenda

GSMA Anti-trust and US entity list stated were noted.

Agenda for the meeting was approved.

2. OPAG#28 Meeting minutes

No comments were made.

Minutes of OPAG#28 (OPAG_29_Doc_02) were approved and action points were reviewed.

3. Release Planning

Reviewed the release planning slide and dates (see OPAG_29_Doc_01). Planning for Block D will be done when next steps are clearer.

4. Block A Federation Definition Support

Tom presented the comments to the E/WBI API document (OPAG_29_Doc_03). No Further questions and comments were raised, but it was agreed to extend the review of the document. Deepak will take the comments raised into account when producing a new revision.

Miguel presented further analysis on the use of NBI APIs for the definition of the EWBI (OPAG_29_Doc_04). Among others, following questions and comments were raised:

- The flows should be investigated to clarify whether subscription process is required.
- Services (and compute flavours) may differ between availability zones. It would thus be useful to cover that information per zone level rather in general.
- A similar discovery service may be required on the NBI as well. There may thus have to be a service API defined in CAMARA.
 - This should be raised to CAMARA together with the remarks from OPAG#28 (e.g. the user identifiers should allow to identify the target network to which the request needs to be routed).

5. Block B – Management and Others

Milan provided a verbal overview of the status of the Block B activities and raised following topics:

- The work is going according to plan with the aim to finalise in July.
- For the API coming from Block D it should be decided whether to include it in the upcoming version of the document or to postpone it to a future version. Given the progress on Block D, the latter is expected to be the way forward.

6. CAMARA Edge API 5GFF contribution

Deepak provided an overview of the APIs that 5GFF had submitted to CAMARA (OPAG_29_Doc_05). Among others, following questions and comments were raised:

- Is the SIMPLE discovery API about discovering the "best" edge? It is.
- 5GFF works from the assumption that the operator doesn't need to be informed about the application and its availability status.
- The APIs are different to those proposed for the OP, but may be complementary with OPAG focussing on the application deployment which isn't covered by the contribution.
 - The models should be aligned though to avoid divergence, especially where there's overlap with the OP approach.
- A UNI API may not fit into CAMARA according to its charter. It would be good to clarify that this is not an issue before spending much effort on the API.
- UNI should be robust and secure (e.g. not allow Denial-of-Service attacks). That might require registration and authentication next to the discovery itself. There may also be a need for alignment with 3GPP SA6.
- It would make sense to wait for Block D analysis before deciding how to move forward.

Deepak will analyse further.

7. ToR status

Tom provided an update on the terms of reference discussion following the call with representatives from the legal teams on 6th July. There seems to be consensus on a "Sandbox" approach with an update of the proposed ToR reflecting that consensus expected to be provided shortly.

8. AOB

Deputy chair candidate nominations are expected by 14th July, noon BST.

A block owner is required still for Block C.

The next OPAG call is OPAG#30 call on 14th July.

Tom gave an update of the planning for the next F2F meeting. Candidate hosts are invited to make themselves known to the GSMA.
